Admission Requirements

For entry into the program, students must fulfill the following:

1. Be at least 18 years of age or;
2. Have already earned Grade 12 standing or;
3. Be 17 years of age and out of public school for at least one year or;
4. Have a written recommendation from a local high school principal, and;
5. Meet with an Educational Advisor at the College to ensure they have selected the correct courses and programs;
6. Complete a placement assessment.

Note: The number of spaces available to students under 18 is limited – please contact your local campus for details.

Financial Aid

All Career and College Prep courses are tuition-free, although there are minimal resource and student fees. Students are also responsible for course textbooks and materials.

Financial aid is available through the Adult Basic Education Student Assistance Plan. Check with an Educational Advisor at your College campus for qualifying criteria.

How to Apply

All students must contact an Educational Advisor before applying to Northwest Community College. Telephone or in person appointments can be arranged by contacting your nearest College campus.

Obtain an Application from any Campus or download an Application from our Web site at www.nwcc.bc.ca. Return the completed form and documents to NWCC. You will be notified by mail regarding the status of your application and when and how to register.

It is important to apply as early as possible as many programs and courses have a limited number of seats. Applicants will be admitted based on the date of their application.

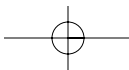

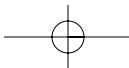

CAREER & COLLEGE PREP

The **Career and College Prep (CCP)** program provides high school level courses for adult students in an adult environment. Through this program students can complete entry requirements for university, career, technical, trades, business and many other post-secondary programs.

Students can also obtain missing high school course requirements to complete their grade 12 high school graduation or the BC Adult Graduation Diploma (Adult Dogwood), or improve their knowledge in preparation for the GED (General Education Development) exam. These adult basic education courses will help students prepare for the work force or meet personal educational goals by improving skills in English, career planning, math, science, social studies and computer technology.

The CCP program provides prerequisite courses for entry into all post-secondary programs offered at NWCC, as well as most programs at other institutions.

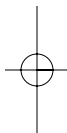
